
2019 TEXAS CENTER FOR THE MISSING ANNUAL REPORT EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Texas Center for the Missing (TCM), a Houston-based 501c3 missing persons organization formerly known as Gabriel's Gifts, was formed in March of 2000 after the disappearance of 17-year-old Gabriel Lester who was reported missing from his high school. Gabriel's mother, a Houston-area businesswoman, decided after his remains were located four months later to turn her tragedy into a positive effort that would have an impact on missing children and their families in Greater Houston.

Her story and vision established TCM's mission to bring hope and healing to the missing and their families through crisis intervention, prevention, and community education.

AMBER ALERT PARTNERS SAVE LIVES


In 2019, TCM issued 6 Amber Alerts for 11 at-risk missing children with 100% recovered safely!

There is no national system for Amber Alert activation.

Each region relies on local resources to successfully implement the recommended national guidelines.

Texas Center for the Missing provides the training and activates all local Amber Alerts via a web-based platform designed specifically for the Houston-Galveston region. Through 2019, Houston's Amber Alert has issued 194 Amber Alerts for 238 endangered missing children with a 95% rate of safe recovery and is credited with saving 92 children out of the 967 recoveries directly attributed to the Amber Alert nationwide.

As the Administrator of the Houston Regional Amber Alert System, TCM remains dedicated to the families served in 2019. TCM truly appreciates the generosity and leadership of the community members who provide funding for this life-saving program.
