

2019 NATIONAL MISSING CHILDREN'S DAY POSTER CONTEST FACT SHEET – TEXAS

Contest Rules

1. Applicants **must** be in the fifth grade.
2. Artwork should reflect the theme **“Bring Our Missing Children Home.”** This phrase **must** appear somewhere on the poster.
3. The theme may be depicted in the student’s artwork through one or a combination of illustrations (e.g., signs and symbols, people, abstract, industry, wildlife, etc.) and can be created using media such as acrylics, watercolor, pencils, charcoal, magic markers, spray paint, crayons, and pastels. Digitally produced images, collages, cut-outs, and stamping **will not** be eligible for consideration.
4. **The finished poster must measure 8½ x 14 inches.**
5. The poster must be submitted with a **completed application**, which includes a description of the poster and a brief biography of the artist, either written legibly or typed.

Judging Criteria

1. Complete contest rules must be followed at all levels of the competition. Incomplete packages and incorrectly sized posters **will not** be eligible for judging. **The finished poster must measure 8½ x 14 inches.**
2. Artwork will be judged on:
 - a. Creativity.
 - b. Reflection of the contest theme.
 - c. Originality in design.
3. Written applications will be judged on:
 - a. Demonstrated comprehension of the theme.
 - b. Clarity.
 - c. Grammar and syntax appropriate to the fifth-grade level.

Awards

At the state level:

- The **single** state winner whose poster is selected to go to the national competition will receive a national award certificate from the U.S. Department of Justice.
- The Texas state winner will receive a framed copy of his/her artwork. A copy will also be displayed in Texas Center for the Missing’s offices.
- The Texas State winner, his/her parents, and his/her teacher will be invited to serve as judges on the 2020 Texas State Level National Missing Children’s Poster Contest judging panel.

At the national level:

- The single **national** winner, his/her teacher (or designee from selected school and parents/guardians (typically two people), and the state manager will be invited to Washington, DC, to participate in the U.S. Department of Justice's National Missing Children's Day ceremony on **May 22, 2019**.
- Transportation and lodging will be provided.
- The national winner will also receive a national award certificate and a professional print of their poster.

Winning Poster

- The winning poster (original and copies) becomes the property of the Department of Justice and will be displayed at the Department of Justice, congressional offices, and other locations as determined by the Youth Development, Prevention & Safety Division and the Department of Justice. Any applicable copyrights will be held by those offices.
- The winning poster may be used in publications, exhibits, and displays, and on websites, as determined by the Youth Development, Prevention & Safety Division and the DOJ.
- The winning poster will be presented as the national symbol for the 2020 Missing Children's Day ceremony and associated activities.
- Photos of the winner and his/her poster will be available through the Youth Development, Prevention & Safety Division and the Department of Justice and will be posted wherever contest information is available.
