
2023 TEXAS CENTER FOR THE MISSING ANNUAL REPORT EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Texas Center for the Missing (TCM), a Houston-based 501c3 missing persons organization formerly known as Gabriel's Gifts, was formed after the disappearance of 17-year-old Gabriel Lester who was reported missing from his high school. Gabriel's mother, a Houston-area businesswoman, decided after his remains were located four months later to turn her tragedy into a positive effort that would have an impact on missing children and their families in Greater Houston.

Her personal story and extraordinary vision established TCM's mission to bring hope and healing to the missing and their families through crisis intervention, prevention, and community education.

AMBER ALERTS AND SILVER ALERTS SAVE LIVES

In 2023, TCM issued 6 Amber Alerts for 6 at-risk missing children AND 37 Silver Alerts for endangered adults battling dementia!

There is no national system for these life-saving Emergency Alert programs. Each region relies on local resources to successfully implement the recommended national guidelines.

Texas Center for the Missing is the sole provider of activation training in the Greater Houston Area and issues ALL local Amber Alerts and Silver Alerts via a web-based platform designed specifically for the Houston-Galveston region. Through 2023, Houston's Amber Alert has issued 211 Amber Alerts for 261 endangered missing children with a 96% rate of safe recovery and is credited with saving 123 children out of the 1,186 recoveries directly attributed to the Amber Alert nationwide.

As the Administrator of the Houston Regional Amber Alert and Silver Systems, TCM remains dedicated to the families served in 2023. TCM truly appreciates the generosity and leadership of the community members who provide funding for these life-saving programs.
