Dear Caring Community Partner:

Please accept this request for funding to launch the **2022 Missing in Harris County Day** project. **It is our hope that you will support this program with a gift in 2022. Your generosity would mean so much!** Left-Behind Families of the long-term missing, caring community members, missing persons support service providers, and law enforcement officers are invited to participate in this effort to help families of missing persons make connections.

The 2022 Missing in Harris County Day will be held on **Saturday, May 14, 2022, from 10 AM - 3 PM** at the Children's Assessment Center, 2500 Bolsover Street, Houston, TX 77005. The day will include: free refreshments, personal guides, semi-private area to talk with missing persons professionals, forensic professionals performing voluntary identification cheek swabs, data entry into the National Missing & Unidentified Persons System (NamUs), panel discussions addressing missing persons issues, and more.

Texas Center for the Missing is a 501c3 missing persons organization with a mission to bring hope and healing to the missing and their families through crisis intervention, prevention, and community education. TCM **serves the community** through prevention education for all ages; **serves law enforcement** through Amber Alert, Silver Alert, and missing persons investigation training; and **serves families** through 24/7 casework assistance for those in crisis. Contrary to popular misconception, TCM receives very little government funding in support of the local Amber Alert and Silver Alert. These life-saving programs are primarily funded by private donations and are solely operated by TCM.

At the request of the Harris County Institute of Forensic Sciences (HCIFS), TCM is the coordinating agency of the 2022 Missing in Harris County Day (MIHCD). MIHCD is a collaborative effort to resolve long-term missing persons cases. Through partnerships with law enforcement providing investigation expertise and intake services, HCIFS providing DNA sampling, and TCM providing health and human services for searching families, it is our goal to reunite families by bringing all resources to bear on these heart-wrenching cases.

The Problem. In 2021, 33,774 Texas children—including 8,869 children from Greater Houston—were reported missing. In addition, 4,143 adults were reported missing from Greater Houston.¹

A missing child is every parent's worst nightmare. A long-term missing loved one is quite simply the worst-case scenario for every left-behind family. With the immense caseload investigating law enforcement agencies must carry, it is imperative that all community resources converge to resolve cases wherever possible. **For example, the Harris County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) began 2021 with 1,695 open missing persons cases. 3,004 new cases were filed in 2021. Investigators closed 3,058 cases with 1,641 remaining open. HCSO's Missing Persons Unit only has 4 full-time investigators.**

The Solution/Project Description. The **2022 Missing in Harris County Day** is a unique project targeted to a specific under-served population—families of the missing. Through the application of investigative

techniques, scientific forensic principles, and community engagement, **MIHCD** is strategically positioned to provide resolution for families searching for missing loved ones.

**Over the course of its 7-year history,
MIHCD has identified 14 missing persons and found 6 missing persons,
providing closure to those families.
You can be part of this continuing success story!**

TCM regional media partners (*e.g., Clear Channel Outdoor, Fox26 News, ESPN Radio, etc.*) will highlight event details and missing persons cases to encourage participation and increase awareness. By creating connections between searching families and all the available resources to solve missing persons cases, Missing in Harris County Day will provide every opportunity to reunite families. TCM's Case Manager will be on-hand to provide follow-up services for the families.

As a whole, these services may reunite families. MIHCD also may, through public awareness, encourage more searching families to engage with existing resources to find their missing loved ones.
